Major Course Requirements

Completion of one course in Symbolic Logic from among the following:

- PHI 201 Formal Logic (4hrs)
- MAT 241 Proof & Logic (4hrs) - Pre-req: MAT 132 with a grade of "C-" or higher.
- One semester of a foreign language, elementary level or higher (4hrs)

Completion of one course in Ethics from among the following:

- PHI 102 Ethical Theory (4hrs)
- Other Courses may apply. Departmental pre-approval is required.

Completion of two courses in History of Philosophy, one focused on Ancient Philosophy and the other on Modern Philosophy, chosen from the following:

- PHI 204 Plato (4hrs)
- PHI 205 Aristotle (4hrs)
- PHI 206 Modern Philosophy (4hrs)

Completion of two courses concerned with Language, Epistemology, Metaphysics and Mind, chosen from the following:

- PHI 302 Epistemology (4hrs) - Pre-req: 8 semester hours in philosophy courses with a grade of "C-" or higher.
- PHI 304 Philosophy of Mind (4hrs)
- PHI 306 Metaphysics (4hrs) - Pre-req: 8 semester hours in philosophy courses with a grade of "C-" or higher.
- PHI 406 Philosophy of Language (4hrs) - Pre-req: PHI 206 and any other Philosophy course.

Completion of two courses to provide depth by examining a major figure or movement, chosen from among the following.

- PHI 305 Nietzsche (4hrs)
 - PHI 307 Existentialism (4hrs) - Pre-req: Two courses in philosophy or permission of the instructor.
 - PHI 490 Advanced Special Topics in Philosophy: Philosophers (4hrs)
- Pre-req: See individual course listing in the current semester course schedule.

Completion of two elective Philosophy classes. One of these may be a cognate course in another discipline. Each such cognate course from another discipline requires departmental pre-approval.

- CRS 101 Theories of Communication and Rhetoric (4hrs)
 - CRS 280 Gender, Culture, and Communication (4hrs)
 - CRS 480 Rhetoric of Human Rights (4hrs)- Pre-req: CRS 101 and junior standing, or permission of the instructor.
 - ENG 101 Ancient Literature (4hrs)
 - ENG 103 18th and 19th Century Literature (4hrs)
 - ENG 210 Research Methods
 - ENG 340 Advanced Topics in Literary and Cultural Studies (4hrs)
- Pre-req: COR 101, COR 102 and one 100-level English course (the last with a grade of "C-" or higher).
- HIS 201 Ancient Greece (4hrs)
 - HIS 202 Roman History (4hrs)
 - POL 201 Constitutional Law (4hrs)- Pre-req: POL 101.
 - POL 211 War (4hrs)
 - POL 441 Seminar in Political Philosophy (4hrs) - Pre-req: Permission of the instructor.
 - PSY 101 Introduction to Psychology (4hrs)
 - PSY 204 Social Psychology (4hrs) - Pre-req: PSY 101.
 - PSY 307 Cognitive Psychology (4hrs) - Pre-req: PSY 101.

Completion of the following

- PHI 405 20th Century Analytic Philosophy (4hrs)- Pre-req: 12 semester hours in philosophy courses with a grade of "C-" or higher.
